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VSU awards graduate scholarship to pioneering VSU honor graduates




he Office of the Dean of the Graduate School (ODGS) held a contract signing ceremony for the grantees of the Scholarship Program for Honor Graduates of VSU on August 18, 2020 at the ODGS Conference Room.

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Grad School tallies highest number of enrollees despite the COVID-19 pandemic



he Graduate School has a total of 522 enrollees for the 1st Semester of SY 2020-2021 despite the COVID-19 pandemic. This is the highest number to date.

Majority of the students were enrolled in the Master of Science program with 272 enrollees. This was followed by the Master of Education, Master of Management and Master of Agricultural Development with 88, 73 and 65 enrollees, respectively.

The Doctor of Philosophy

program had 20 enrollees and the Master of Land Administration and Management had the least with only 4 enrollees.

From 1st Sem SY 2016-2017, the number of enrollees has increased from 374 to 522 at present. This is almost 30% increase in enrollment in a span of five years.

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BOR approves proposal for foreign GTA program



he Board of Regents (BOR) of the Visayas State University (VSU) has approved the Graduate School proposal on the Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) Grant to Foreign Graduate Students on November 19, 2020.

The foreign GTA grant is one strategy to attract foreign graduate students to pursue their graduate study in the VSU in line with the internationalization program of the university. To qualify for the said grant, the foreign applicant must comply with the following requirements:

- 1. Must come from Asia, USA, Australia, Africa and Europe and graduated with scholastic standing from a reputable institution/university.
- 2. He/she must first gain admission to the VSU Graduate School.
- 3. Transcript of Records with contact address (email address/Contact Number) of the University Registrar/College Dean
- 4. Recommendation Letter from former professor with Contact

- Number/e email address of the signatory of the letter
- 5. Certificate of good moral character from the university with contact no. and address of the signatory of the certificate.
- 6. Must submit a Motivation Letter in pursuing a graduate degree program
- 7. Must have a research plan on the field sought.
- 8. Must have a student visa and comply other requirements set by the International office of VSU;
- 9. Must have a competency and fluency of English for applicants from Non-English speaking countries; (Certificate of English Proficiency)

The qualified scholars will have the following privileges:

- 1. Free School Fees (Tuition, Laboratory and Miscellaneous
- 2. Stipend of P 25,000.00 per month
- 3. Book Allowance of 2, 500 per

semester

- 4. Medical Insurance of P 2,000.00 peryear
- 5. Transportation: Round Trip Economy Plane ticket for graduate teaching assistants from Asia and subsidy of \$500 for graduate teaching assistants from Europe and USA.
- 6. Thesis/Dissertation support of \$ 1,000 for Master's and \$2,000 for Doctoral

The foreign GTAs will be working in the different academic departments of the university offering graduate programs. They will assist the department in its various activities in instruction under the guidance of a graduate

Their tasks include teaching a maximum of 9 units per semester and to assist the faculty in the conduct of lecture and laboratory classes, help in complying requirements for accreditation, and do other tasks that may be assigned by the faculty of department head. -RJOgalesco & WTOclinaria


This was followed by an Open Forum where graduate students were able to ask questions related to their graduate study, and they were also able to give feedback to the services given by the Graduate School.

Crossref is an official Digital Object Identifier (DOI) Registration Agency of the International DOI Foundation. It is run by the Publishers International Linking Association Inc.

Google Scholar is a freely accessible web search engine that indexes the full text or metadata of scholarly literature across an array

of publishing formats and disciplines.

AGRIS is the International System for Agricultural Science and Technology, a global, multilingual bibliographic database that connects users directly to a rich collection of research and worldwide technical information on food and agriculture.

These platforms make the online visibility and easy access of SHJ not just in the country, but all over the world of science.
