CELESTE NETWORK COLLABORATES WITH VSU

The University of Leuven in Belgium partners with VSU through their CELESTE network project which was launched on January 16, 2023. The virtual launching of the project was attended by other academic partners namely, North West University in South Africa, Pontificia Universidad Cattolica del Peru, VNU of Hanoi, Vietnam and the Visayas State University represented by Graduate School, Dr. Anabella B. Tulin. The CELESTE network which stands for "society, EcoLogy, space and SusTainable development" is a partnership originating from the Masters in Sustainable Development and is expected to evolve over time through new collaborations. It gathers in an international learning community academics, students, alumni and practitioners co-producing inter-/ transdisciplinary, gender-sensitive, decolonial and research-driven education for sustainable development. Among its main goals and activities for the next five years is to facilitate the exchange of students and staff as well as co-supervise thesis and internships, actively connect and involve different non-academic actors and institutions interested in sustainable development and co-create new educational modules and digital material that can be used by all partners in the curricula of their programs.

Each member of the network has its various field of expertise. As for VSU, areas of specialization will be



on climate change, disasters, resilience, gender, food, marine science, tropical ecology and forestry. These will be managed by the concerned institute/college namely, College of Forest and Environmental Science (CFES), Institute for Strategic Research and Development Studies (ISRDS) and Institute for Tropical Ecology and Environental Management (ITEEM).

One of the proposed activities by the CELESTE network will be a three-day workshop that will be held in Kruger National Park, South Africa on June 13-16, 2023. This activity aims to produce a joint publication and set the CELESTE network agenda for the next four years. The CELESTE network will be chaired in a rotating manner by the different partners who will set the agenda and organize activities in line with the specific Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and regions they wish to focus on. ing intended to provide graduate students from UC member institutions with a valuable opportunity to share fresh insights, research concepts, and personal experiences in an inclusive environment. Its fundamental objective is to cultivate interdisciplinary studand stimulate the merging of research efforts through strategic alliances among UC members. Furthermore, the forum strives to enhance connections both within and between UC member institutions, fostering a culture of collaboration and cooperation.

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


