Grad School tallies highest number of graduates for SY 2017-2018

he Graduate School produced a total of 85 graduates under the VSU graduate degree programs during the 65th VSU Commencement Exercise on June 15, 2018 held at the VSU Upper Oval Grounds. This is a 48% increase of graduates compared to the last SY 2016-2017 with 44 graduates.

There were five (5) graduates under the Doctor of Philosophy program, fifty four (54) graduates under the Master of Science program, nine (9) graduates under the Master of Management program, fifteen (15) graduates under the Master of Education program, and two (2) graduates under the Master of Agricultural



Development program.

On the other hand, Mr. Cyrill M. Godinez, a MSc Animal Science student, was recognized during the President's Tribute on June 14,

2018 at the VSU Research and Development Hall for garnering the highest grade point average of 1.17 among all the graduate students.

he Graduate School conducted an Echo Seminar-Workshop on the 1st Association of Education Researchers and Trainers (ASSERT) National Convention on Outcome-Based Education (NC-OBE) held at the Center for Continuing Education, VSU, Visca, Baybay City, Leyte on February 7, 2018.

Dr. Anabella B. Tulin, GS Dean, echoed the discussion of Dr. William Spady on how did the "real" OBE get to the Philippines, and the implementing the essence

and power of "real" OBE. Dr. Tulin emphasized that OBE is what learners can actually do with what they know and have learned. Or simply, the tangible application of what has been learned in a classroom.

On the other hand, Dr. Marilyn N. Manaig, College of Education Secretary, echoed the Triadic Lenses of Outcome-Based Education: Theory, Practices & Administration discussed by Dr. Jonathan V. Macayan, and the OBE in K to 12: Impetus for Continuous

Improvement and Ability by Dr. Warren A. Ramos.
