The award is annually given by CSC-Honors and Award (HAP) Committee an individual or group of individuals for exceptional or extraordinary contributions resulting from an idea or performance that had nationwide impact on public interest, security and patrimony.

In winning the Regional Award, Dr. Tulin was cited in developing integrated nutrient management and use of macro and micro nutrient biofortification technology which enhances the growth, yield and quality of root crops and vegetables thereby making unproductive acid and volcanic soils highly productive for vegetables and root crops production. The said technology on micronutrient fertilizers increase the yield of purple yam for up to 21 tons per hectare which is about 300% from the national average of 7 tons tons per ha.

She also developed micronutrient bio-fertilizers for organic farming that enhances the release of micronutients such as iron, copper and zinc from their fixed immobilized state to soluble use by plants.
